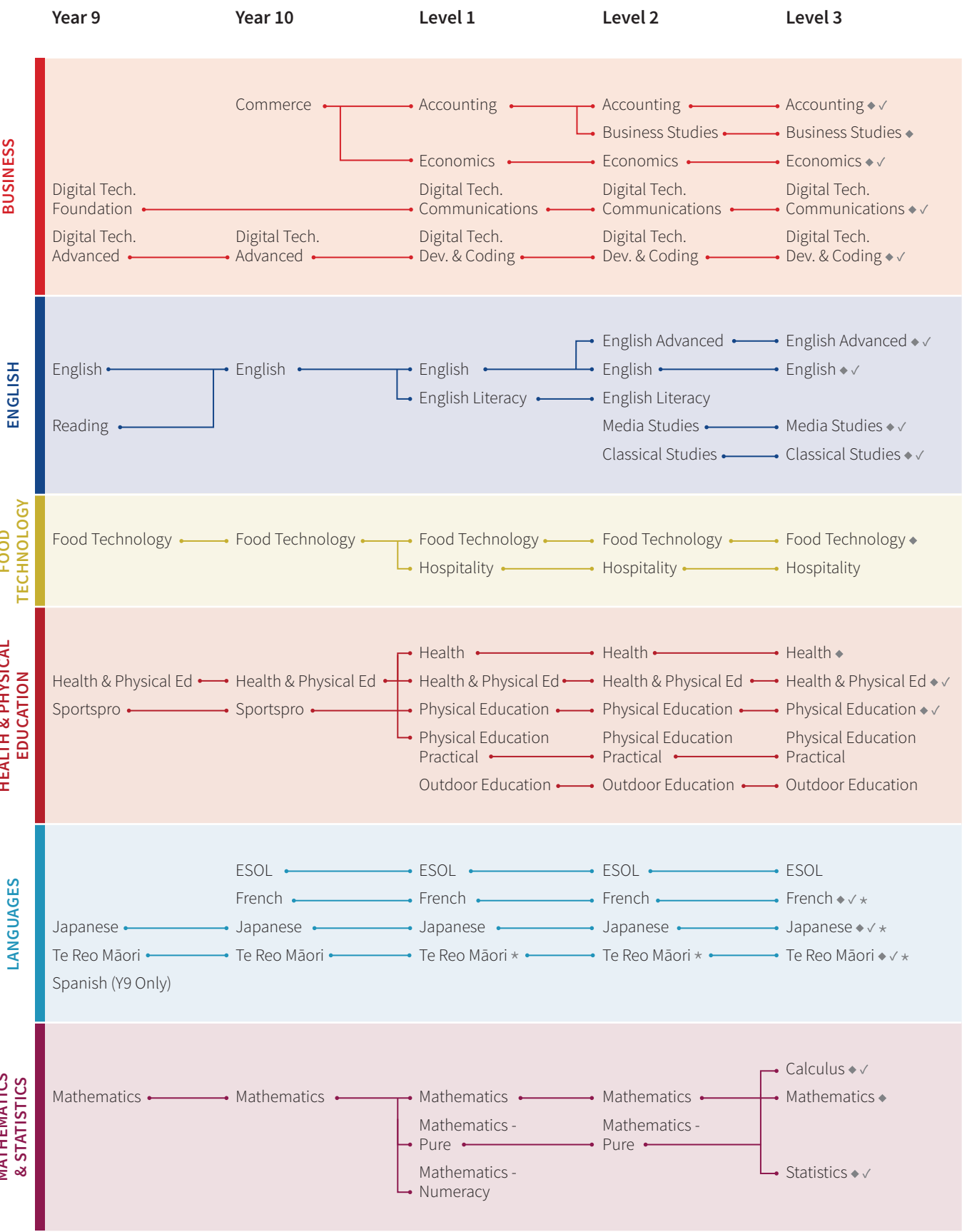
The College offers:

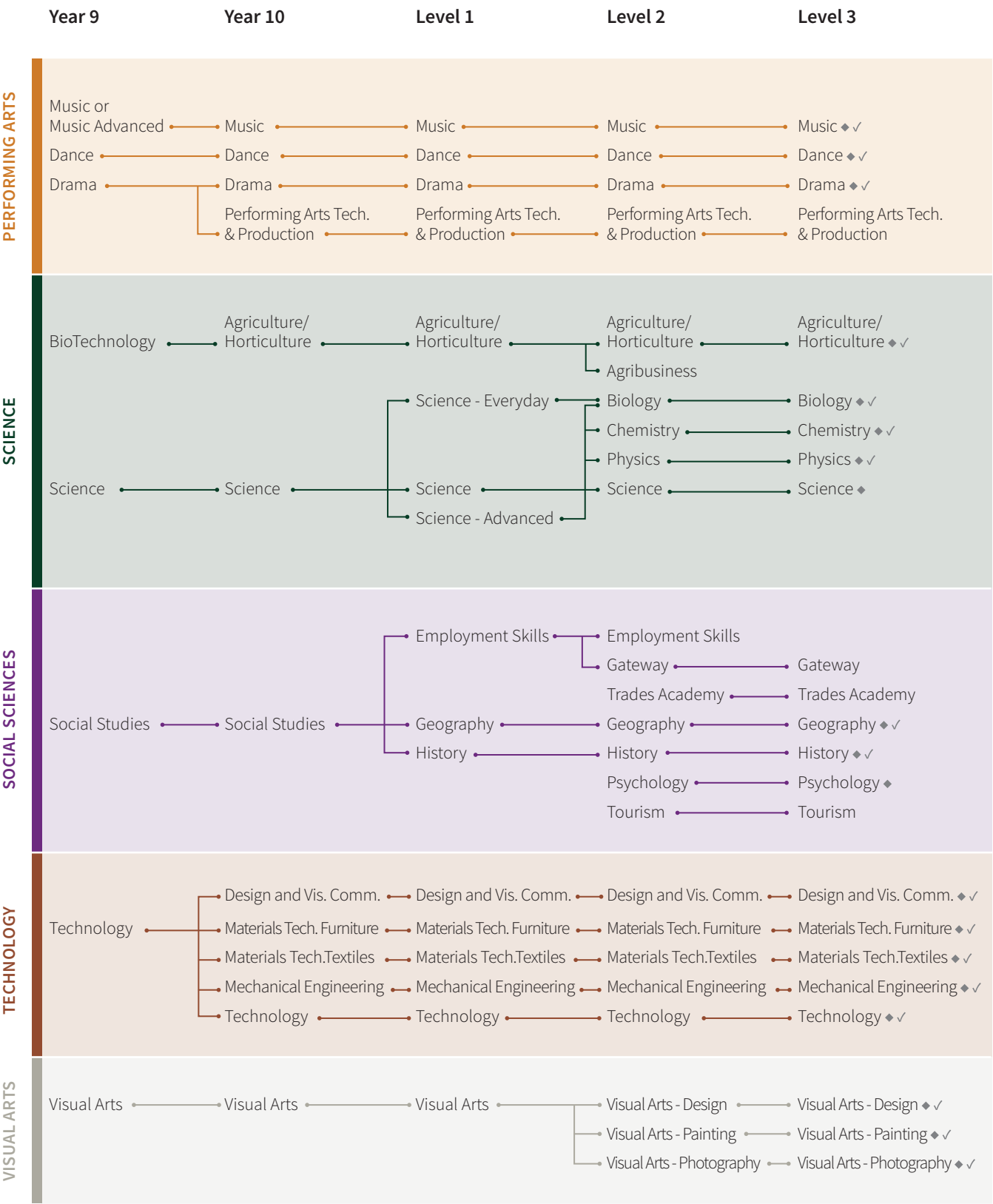

Connected through sports

Waimea College has an excellent record of achievement at regional and national level in a number of sports and is represented by teams and individuals in many codes.

You will be encouraged to participate in a variety of sports, at either competitive or social levels, to enhance your overall health and well-being. We have a huge range of sporting codes on offer, including the major sports of basketball, cricket, football, hockey, netball, rugby, volleyball and multisport.

We encourage you to find your strengths, and provide the guidance to plan your course of study, set short and long-term goals and assist you to achieve them.

We have an excellent reputation for commitment to student support provided by teachers, deans, guidance and support staff, including pastoral care for the needs of Māori students to succeed and achieve as Māori. Together, we develop your sense of turangawaewae through encouraging the STRIVE values of Waimea College.

Your support network:

- belonging to one of four Houses: Cooper, Hillary, Rutherford and Sheppard;
- the Houses are divided into a number of Form Groups;
- your Form Teacher and Deans who are responsible for your pastoral care;
- your Deans follow your year group throughout your time at Waimea College to provide consistent support;
- a well-resourced Guidance and Learning Centre where fully trained counsellors, social workers and access to some health services, should you require additional support;
- 24/7 Youth Workers.

The outdoor classroom

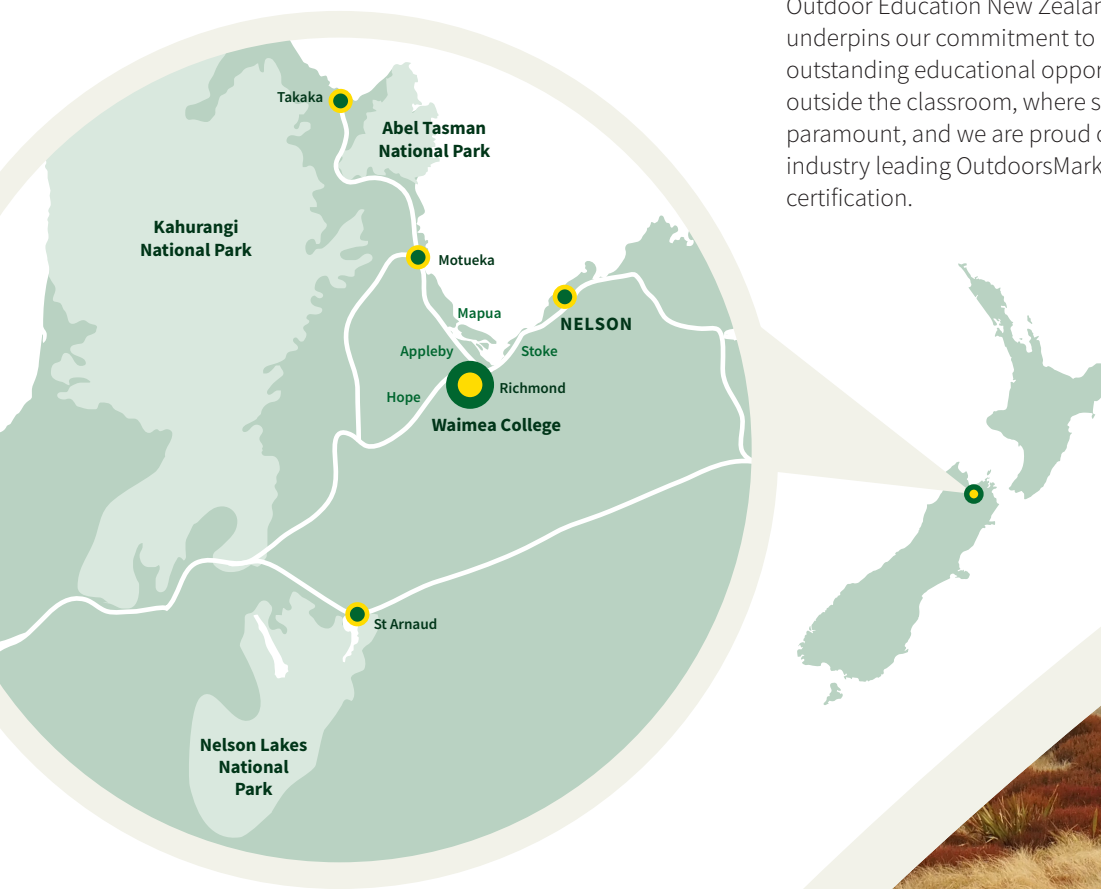
Te akomanga o waho

In close proximity to three National Parks, our region is an adventure-seekers' paradise. It provides an incredible classroom for all students to experience exhilarating outdoor activities through our extensive Outdoor Education programme.

In Year 9 you will have the opportunity to attend camps in our great outdoors. The focus of the camps is to challenge you personally while working as a team, and includes activities such as tramping, rafting, canoeing or kayaking, and a confidence course.

In Years 11, 12 or 13 you can participate in a range of outdoor pursuits such as kayaking, rock-climbing, tramping, alpine skills and mountain biking.

Waimea College's membership of Outdoor Education New Zealand underpins our commitment to outstanding educational opportunities outside the classroom, where safety is paramount, and we are proud of our industry leading OutdoorsMark Safety Audit certification.
