The huge range of opportunities available at Waimea College is what sets us apart. We offer a broad curriculum, with one of the largest range of subjects of any school in the country. This means there is something here for you to individualise your learning.

Our staff are well-qualified and carefully selected professionals. They are committed to supporting your achievement and success in all curriculum areas.

At the junior level there are several compulsory subjects from the eight learning areas of the New Zealand Curriculum. In addition, you can select from a range of option subjects from The Arts, Languages and the Technology Curriculums. These feature learning that is engaging and responsive to your needs and focus on the key competencies.

The College offers:

- a comprehensive range of subjects from Year 9 to 13 leading to the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Levels 1, 2 and 3;
- a comprehensive range of senior subjects including Trades Academy and Vocational Pathway options;
- education of Tikanga Māori and Te Reo Māori;
- a technology rich curriculum delivery including BYOD (Bring Your Own Device);
- a BYOD strategy that is built on extensive research into emerging best practices, insights from other schools’ BYOD experiences, and feedback from our dedicated teaching and support staff;
- enhanced student learning and collaboration from using personal devices;
- additional opportunities to accelerate learning and extend any special abilities in a range of curriculum areas;
- additional assistance if you need help with your learning, via specialised support through our student support network.

Our goal for you is to become a person who is resilient and able to cope well with the demands of the modern world, while retaining your natural curiosity and creativity and accepting of those who are socially and ethnically different to you.

At Waimea College, every student is part of a Whānau class, a small group of students from the same year level. The Whānau Kaiarahi (guide) is a teacher that will stay with the Whānau class for their whole time at Waimea College and will act as the first point of contact for both akonga and whānau.

Whānau time occurs three times a week, focusing on fostering a growth mindset and a positive attitude towards learning. During these sessions, students engage in goal setting and organisational skills, develop personal and social capabilities, enhance their well-being through meaningful actions, and explore sustainability and global issues.

We have an excellent reputation for commitment to student support provided by teachers, Deans, counselling and support staff, this includes pastoral care for the needs of Māori students to succeed and achieve as Māori. Together, we develop your sense of turangawaewae through encouraging the values of Waimea College.

Your support network includes:

- belonging to one of six Houses: Carrington, Cooper, Hillary, Ngata, Rutherford and Sheppard;
- the Houses are divided into a number of Whānau Groups;
- your Whānau Kaiārahi and Deans who are responsible for your pastoral care;
- your Deans follow your Whānau Group throughout your time at Waimea College to provide consistent support;
- a well-resourced Counselling Centre with fully trained counsellors and access to some health services, should you require additional support;
- The Kura Hub is a learning space to cater for small groups and individual learning needs.
- 24/7 Youth Workers.

The outdoor classroom

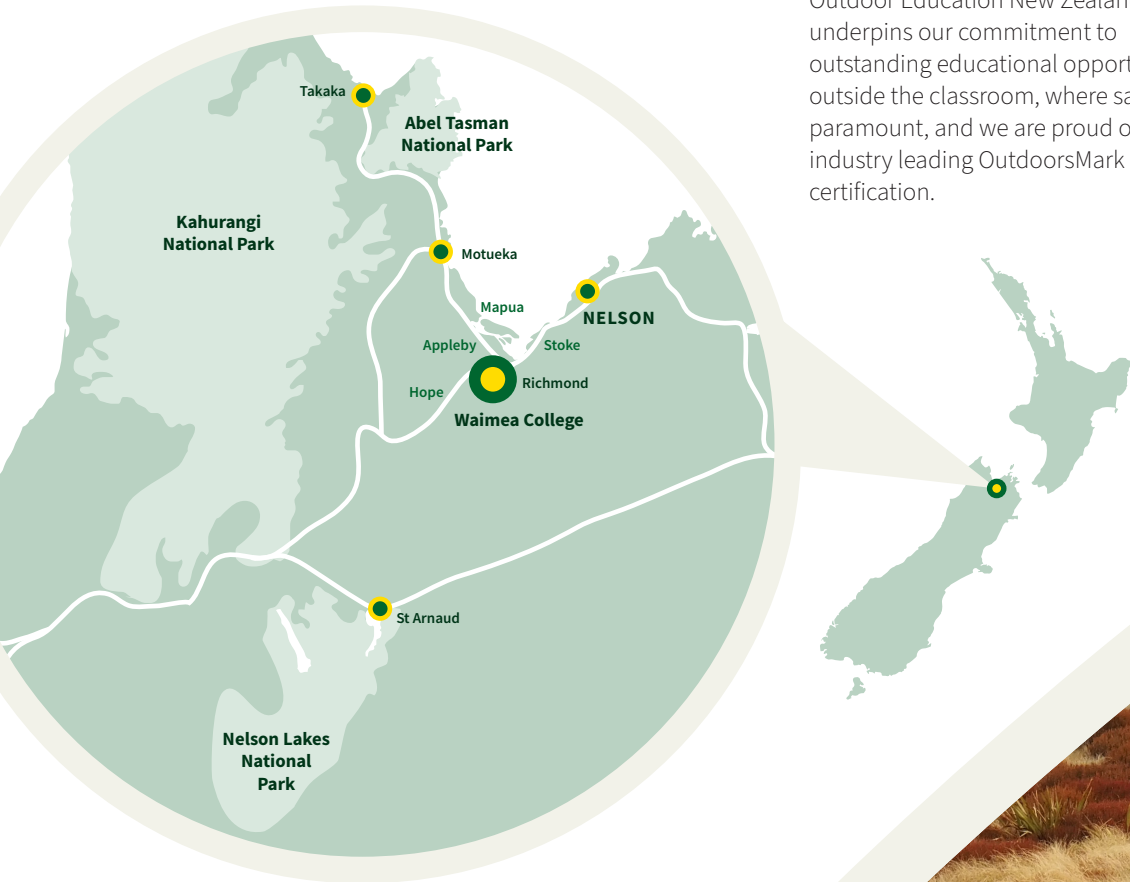
Te akomanga o waho

In close proximity to three National Parks, our region is an adventure-seekers’ paradise. It provides an incredible classroom for all students to experience exhilarating outdoor activities through our extensive Outdoor Education programme.

In Year 9 you will have the opportunity to attend camps in our great outdoors. The focus of the camps is to challenge you personally while working as a team, and includes activities such as tramping, rafting, canoeing or kayaking, and a confidence course.

In Years 11, 12 or 13 you can participate in a range of outdoor pursuits such as kayaking, rock-climbing, tramping, alpine skills and mountain biking.

Waimea College’s membership of Outdoor Education New Zealand underpins our commitment to outstanding educational opportunities outside the classroom, where safety is paramount, and we are proud of our industry leading OutdoorsMark Safety certification.
